


Certificate of Source

We hereby certify the
Port Orford Cedar tonewood utilized in this instrument
Oregon Wild Wood item # _____, was sourced as follows:

This Port Orford Cedar (Lawson Cypress) was salvaged from the mountains of SW Oregon. In 2002 an enormous fire named the Biscuit Fire, raged through the Siskiyou National Forest in Oregon. It took nearly 6 months to extinguish and consumed over 500,000 acres.

In its wake were many dead but harvestable Port Orford Cedar trees. Many were very old with ring counts in the 800 to 1000 year range, well exceeding the normal 500-year limit of this species.

This tonewood was salvaged from those old fire damaged trees, transported to our facility, sawn into slabs, air-dried and resawn into tonewood parts. To the best of our knowledge, the acquisition and harvest of this item was in compliance with all applicable laws.
