


Certificate of Source

We hereby certify the
Myrtlewood tonewood utilized in this instrument
Oregon Wild Wood item # _____, was sourced as follows:

This old growth Myrtlewood was salvaged from the Southern Oregon coastal region, in an area from the Rogue River south to the California border.

We only select trees that are standing dead or dying, blown down by wind, or had been cut and left behind by the timber companies in their pursuit of Fir and Spruce. These trees came from lower elevations in wetter areas, which yields the highest color contrasts. The salvaged stumps and trunk sections were carefully removed from the forest, transported to our miller, allowed to cure, sawn into slabs, air-dried and resawn into tonewood parts. To the best of our knowledge, the acquisition and harvest of this item was in compliance with all applicable laws.
