We hereby certify the
Pistachio tonewood utilized in this instrument
Oregon Wild Wood item # _____, was sourced as follows:

This Pistachio tonewood was salvaged from commercial Pistachio nut groves in northern California. Pistachios are grown commercially utilizing trees with grafted stock.

As the trees grow, below the graft, the trunk is brown, white and black and above the graft is a mix of pink, purple, green, white, black, brown and more, with a beautiful graft line where they meet. These trees only have a limited productive lifespan, and then must be replaced. The trunks are small, and with no other commercial value, they were usually chipped and turned to mulch.

These grove-salvaged Pistachio trunks were transported to Oregon, sawn into slabs, air-dried and resawn into tonewood parts. To the best of our knowledge, the acquisition and harvest of this item was in compliance with all applicable laws.
