


Certificate of Source

We hereby certify the
Claro Walnut tonewood utilized in this instrument
Oregon Wild Wood item # _____, was sourced as follows:

This Claro Walnut tonewood was salvaged from trees located on urban and rural properties throughout the State of Oregon. The trees were all damaged, dead or dying or needed to be removed for safety considerations. Many of these trees are 100 years old or more. They are carefully removed from the site, piece by piece, milled, air-dried and resawn into tonewood parts.

It is interesting to note that Claro Walnut did not occur as a species until the cross pollination of the native California Black Walnut and the English Walnut, which arrived on the west coast in the first half of the 1800's. To the best of our knowledge, the acquisition and harvest of this item was in full compliance with all applicable laws.
